### Governor Abbott Allows Virtual And Telephonic Open Meetings To Maintain Government Transparency

Ensures continued government operation while preserving transparency

AUSTIN - Governor Greg Abbott today acted to maintain government transparency and continued government operations while reducing face-to-face contact for government open meetings. As Texas works to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, the Governor granted the Office of the Attorney General's request for suspension of certain open-meeting statutes. This temporary suspension will allow for telephonic or videoconference meetings of governmental bodies that are accessible to the public in an effort to reduce in-person meetings that assemble large groups of people.

"Even as the State of Texas takes precautionary measures to contain the spread of COVID-19, we also have a responsibility to maintain government transparency," said Governor Abbott. "With today's action, Texas is reducing non-essential in-person contact for a limited period, while ensuring that state and local government entities continue to work to fulfill necessary functions and with full transparency for the people of Texas. I urge state and local officials to do their part to mitigate the spread of COVID-19 by avoiding meetings that bring people into large group settings."

In accordance with section 418.016 of the Texas Government Code, Governor Abbott has suspended various provisions that require government officials and members of the public to be physically present at a specified meeting location. This temporary suspension will leave important open-meeting protections in place:

- Members of the public will be entitled to participate and address the governmental body during any telephonic or videoconference meeting.
- To hold a telephonic or videoconference meeting, a governmental body must post a
  written notice that gives the public a way to participate remotely, such as a toll-free
  dial-in number, and that includes an electronic copy of any agenda packet that
  officials will consider at the meeting.
- A governmental body must provide the public with access to a recording of any telephonic or videoconference meeting.

State and local officials who have questions about open-meeting requirements after this suspension should submit them to the Office of the Attorney General via e-mail at <a href="mailto:TOMA@oag.texas.gov">TOMA@oag.texas.gov</a>, or by leaving a message at (888) 672-6787. Officials with questions about teleconference and videoconference capabilities offered by the Texas Department of Information Resources should visit dir.texas.gov or call (512) 475-4700. Officials who hold videoconference meetings are encouraged to provide for participation via telephone for members of the public without videoconferencing capability. If officials are not holding a telephonic or videoconference meeting, all open-meeting requirements apply.

# Governor's Office Clears Path for Governmental Bodies to Meet Telephonically or by

# Videoconference During Coronavirus Disaster

AUSTIN - Governor Abbott's office today approved a request by the Office of the Attorney General to temporarily suspend a limited number of open meeting laws in response to the Coronavirus (COVID-19) disaster. This action will allow governmental bodies to conduct meetings by telephone or video conference to advance the public health goal of limiting face-to-face meetings (also called "social distancing") to slow the spread of the Coronavirus (COVID-19).

Importantly, however, this action does not suspend requirements that governmental bodies conduct meetings in a transparent and accessible manner. Specifically, governmental bodies are still be required to do the following:

 provide online written notice containing a public toll-free dial-in number or a freeof-charge videoconference link, as well as an electronic copy of any agenda packet,

- before conducting telephonic or video conference meetings;
- provide the public with access and a means to participate in those meetings,
   preferably through two-way audio or video connections; and
- provide the public with access to a recording of those meetings.

#### I. CALL TO ORDER

Steve Montgomery called the August 27, 2020 TCHD Finance Committee meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. Members present represented a quorum to conduct Committee business.

#### II. CITIZENS WISHING TO ADDRESS THE COMMITTEE

There were no citizens present wishing to address the Finance Committee.

#### III. MINUTES

Mr. Montgomery asked the Committee to review minutes from the July 23, 2020, Tarrant County Hospital District Joint Board of Managers and Finance Committee Meeting and called for a motion. Charlie Powell made a motion for approval; motion was seconded by Dr. Charles Webber and carried unanimously.

#### IV. CFO REPORT

Sharon Clark reported to the Committee that the Fiscal Year 2021 Budget will be presented to the Commissioners Court on September 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

### V. MATTERS THAT REQUIRE DISCUSSION AND COMMITTEE ACTION

#### A. Consider Acceptance of July 2020 Unaudited Financial Report

Ms. Clark presented the Unaudited Financial Report for July 2020.

#### Hospital:

July Financials continue to be impacted by COVID-19.

Inpatient Admissions were slightly higher than prior month for the month of July. Patient Days were 4% below budget. Patient acuity, measured by Case Mix Index exceeded budget by 11% for the month. Length of Stay was on target for the month.

Emergency Department Visits were unfavorable for the month compared to budget but trending up slightly. Urgent Care Visits were below budget for the month of July but are also slowly trending up. Primary Care Visits and Specialty Clinic Visits have increased from prior month, which includes Telehealth visits. For the month, 24,000 telehealth visits were performed.

Inpatient Surgeries and Outpatient Surgeries remain level to the prior month, due to COVID-19 restrictions. Invasive Lab cases were below budget.

Psychiatric Patient Days were unfavorable by 1% for the month of July. Psychiatric Clinic Visits were below budget by 1% for the month. Psychiatric Emergency Visits were at a yearly high for the month of July.

Days Cash on Hand Available for Operations was 333 days. Net Account Receivable Days are 42 days. FTE's per Adjusted Patient Day were unfavorable at 6.04 compared to year-to-date target of 5.60.

JPS Connection enrollment for July reflects enrollment of 43,011 members.

Net Patient Revenue was favorable by 8% for the month compared to budget. Purchased Services was favorable by 6% for the month compared to budget. Salaries and Related Expenses were unfavorable by 3%, due to lower volumes and savings in the benefits area.

For the month, Income from Operations was \$9.4 million compared to a budgeted Income from Operations of \$5.8 million. Year-to-date Income from Operations was \$61.3 million compared to a budgeted \$52.1 million.

#### Acclaim:

Physician Billed Encounters were unfavorable for the month by 21%.

Net Patient Revenue was unfavorable by 16% for the month compared to budget.

For the month, Acclaim's financial statements reflected a \$3.1 million Loss from Operations compared to a budgeted loss of \$2.0 million.

Combined Income Statement for the month reflected \$6.3 million Income from Operations compared to a budgeted income of \$3.9 million. Year-to-date, the Combined Income Statement reflected an Income from Operations of \$29.9 million compared to a budgeted income of \$31.5 million. \$8.2 million reported from the COVID relief funds that was initially located in Other Operating Revenue has been moved to the Non-operating Revenue.

There being no further questions or discussion, Mr. Montgomery called for a motion to accept the July 2020 Unaudited Financial Report. Mr. Powell made a motion for approval; motion was seconded by Dr. Webber as presented and the motion carried unanimously.
