


Health and Wellness

In an effort to increase the health and wellness of our community, JPS provides a variety of health programs and services. Examples include health education seminars and disease management classes. JPS also provides preventative services such as flu vaccines, screenings for breast, colon, and prostate cancer along with direct medical care for all.



COVID-19 Disparities Grant

JPS Community Outreach received grant funding from the Tarrant County Public Health Department to mobilize and collaborate with partners to address health disparities related to COVID-19. This grant opportunity allows JPS to educate Tarrant County's most vulnerable populations about COVID-19 and encourage vaccination.

New Community Outreach Initiatives







JPS Health Network, in partnership with the City of Fort Worth's Como Community Center, implemented a pilot wellness program that focuses on care coordination, health education, navigation and information, and wellness and prevention activities.

The Health and Wellness Program provides enhanced care coordination and navigation services to patients and community members. This is a unique opportunity to deploy health education and wellness programs outside of the traditional hospital setting.

As a community engagement and population health management strategy, the program offers a place along the continuum of care to encourage patient self-management and promote and encourage behavior change.

The Health and Wellness Program offers specific health classes and resources focused on; behavioral health, heart disease, diabetes, COVID-19, nutrition, injury prevention, and referrals to other social services.



Tarrant Area Food Bank RED Bus Partnership

Using a Social Determines of Health (SDoH) questionnaire, JPS identified food, transportation, and housing as the top three needs among JPS patients. JPS Health Network established a partnership with the Tarrant Area Food Bank RED Bus to address food insecurities JPS patients are experiencing. The RED Bus provides emergency food assistance and assistance with SNAP, WIC, and Medicaid applications onsite. This partnership helps with the immediate need while also connecting patients and their families to options for long-term solutions and assistance. During RED Bus events, participants also receive information about JPS connections. Community resource guides are also offered to assist with other needs participants may have.



Monthly Newsletter Expansion

The JPS Community Outreach Newsletter provides an opportunity to share information including health related topics, community highlights, and much more. Our newsletter has grown and currently reaches over 500 contacts each month.

8th Annual Healthy Lives Matter Prostate Cancer Screening

Date: February 12, 2022

Summary: Commissioner Brooks sponsors the annual Tarrant County - Precinct One Prostate Cancer Screening Event. The purpose of the event is to provide men with free prostate cancer screenings as well as provide men and their families' educational support through increased awareness. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, this event was hosted virtually. This event resulted in referrals to the JPS Eligibility & Enrollment Center. Individuals were educated about the signs and symptoms of prostate cancer and the importance of early detection.
