Designed to enhance convenience, accessibility, and health outcomes, the facility will integrate a wide range of essential health services in one location. These services include primary care, behavioral health, x-ray, ultrasound, laboratory diagnostics, and a community education space for health and wellness programs. Additionally, the facility will feature on-site specialists including cardiology, gastroenterology and optometry, a full-service drive-through pharmacy, and dedicated space for specialty pharmacy services.
